



Regulations regarding

Decisions that can be appealed to the Board of Appeals at Jönköping University (HJÖN)

The following decisions can be appealed to the Board of Appeals at Jönköping University:

1. Decisions by the Disciplinary Committee to invoke Disciplinary Measures against a student: Warning or Suspension.
2. Decisions by the Disciplinary Committee to expel a student from education at Jönköping University.
3. Decisions by a faculty of one of the University's schools (through the Study Administration):
 - 3.1 to reject an applicant on the grounds that they do not meet the entry requirements for admission to a first- or second-cycle course or study programme (including assessment of actual competence),
 - 3.2 to not make an exception to entry requirements,
 - 3.3 to not grant deferred enrolment to an applicant admitted to a first- or second-cycle course or study programme,
 - 3.4 on transferring credits for courses or a study programme,
 - 3.5 to refuse a student's request to obtain a degree or course certificate, but not if the decision is based on the student being suspended indefinitely due to unpaid tuition fees,
 - 3.6 on withdrawing admission, if the admission decision is incorrect and the error is due to the student/applicant providing incorrect or misleading information.
4. Decisions by a faculty of one of the University's schools:
 - 4.1 to refuse a student's request for exemption from a compulsory element of their study programme,
 - 4.2 to refuse a student's request for leave from studies,
 - 4.3 to withdraw the right to supervision and other resources from a doctoral student.
5. Decisions that are subject to appeal under Chapter 4, Section 18 of the Discrimination Act (2008:567).
6. Decisions to refuse a student's request to have their tuition fees refunded, in whole or in part, if the request is made on the grounds that the student is prevented from attending the courses or study programme due to special circumstances, in accordance with provisions decided by the President for students admitted from the autumn semester 2018 onwards.
